NEW ENGLAND CHAPTER OF GITA – ED FORREST INTERNSHIP

PURPOSE:

Encourage students to enter this professional field by providing hands – on working experience with a local company affiliated with geospatial information technologies.

The New England Chapter of GITA’s Board of Directors is sending notice to schools in the New England area with a degree program in geospatial information technology or related field to alert them that students enrolled in their program are eligible to submit an application for an Ed Forrest internship from the New England Chapter of GITA no later than February 16, 2010. The New England Chapter of GITA will have a list of member companies willing to participate in the internship program. The eligible student will be awarded the internship for the summer 2010.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE INTERNSHIP

The applicant must be enrolled in a New England College, University or Technical School and majoring in a Geospatial Technology field. The Board must receive applications no later than February 16, 2010. The Board of Directors will review the applications and make its final selections in February. The successful applicants will be notified in early March, 2010 and be given the list of companies willing to participate. The companies willing to participate will also be sent the list of students who have won the scholarship. **It is the responsibility of the student to solicit the company to make final arrangements for the internship.**

The company will hire the student for at least a 10-week commitment between May and September 2010. The student’s salary would come from the sponsoring company with addition of the GITA **\$2000 stipend**. At the end of the fifth week, both the company and student will submit an interim report to the Board. If all seems in order, the Board will vote to release the GITA stipend to the student.

At the end of the 10-week period, the company and the student will make a presentation to the Board outlining the work accomplished.
